Legislative Update - STATE NEWS

The following are the 9 constitutional amendments that appeared on the November ballot:

Proposition 1 (HJR 62) The constitutional amendment authorizing the legislature to provide for an exemption from ad valorem taxation of all or part of the market value of the residence homestead of the surviving spouse of a member of the armed services of the United States who is killed in action. **PASSED**

Proposition 2 (HJR 79) The constitutional amendment eliminating an obsolete requirement for a State Medical Education Board and a State Medical Education Fund, neither of which is operational. PASSED

Proposition 3 (HJR 133) The constitutional amendment to authorize a political subdivision of this state to extend the number of days that aircraft parts that are exempt from ad valorem taxation due to their location in this state for a temporary period may be located in this state for purposes of qualifying for the tax exemption." **PASSED**

Proposition 4 (HJR 24) The constitutional amendment authorizing the legislature to provide for an exemption from ad valorem taxation of part of the market value of the residence homestead of a partially disabled veteran or the surviving spouse of a partially disabled veteran if the residence homestead was donated to the disabled veteran by a charitable organization. **PASSED**

Proposition 5 (SJR 18) The constitutional amendment to authorize the making of a reverse mortgage loan for the purchase of homestead property and to amend lender disclosures and other requirements in connection with a reverse mortgage loan. PASSED

Proposition 6 (SJR 1) The constitutional amendments providing for the creation of the State Water Implementation Fund for Texas and the State Water Implementation Revenue Fund for Texas to assist in the financing of priority projects in the state water plan to ensure the availability of adequate water resources. **PASSED**

Proposition 7 (HJR 87) The constitutional amendment authorizing a home-rule municipality to provide in its charter the procedure to fill a vacancy on its governing body for which the unexpired term is 12 months or less. PASSED (Continued on Page 5)

TFRW Convention Highlights

On October 17-19 seven delegates from WCRW attended the biennial convention of the Texas Federation of Republican Women. Delores Culley, Annette Barfield, Martha Hall, Missy Shorey, Nancy Bukowski, Eileen Levy and Amy DeVries made the long drive to San Antonio to meet with the other 500+ delegates to the convention. In addition to the business of the convention (electing officers, amending by-laws, etc,) valuable information was obtained and contacts made. Legislative Update – Continued from Page 2

Proposition 8 (HJR 147 and SJR 54) The constitutional amendment repealing Section 7, Article IX, Texas Constitution, which relates to the creation of a hospital district in Hidalgo County. PASSED

Proposition 9 (SJR 42) The constitutional amendment relates to expanding the types of sanctions that may be assessed against a judge or justice following a formal proceeding instituted by the State Commission on Judicial Conduct.

PASSED

- Little information is known at this time to determine whether or not the voter ID law infringed on citizen's rights.
- Compared to the last Constitutional Amendment election held in 2011, voter turnout was higher in 2013. 8.5% of the electorate voted in 2013 compared to 5.4% in 2011.

FEDERAL NEWS

- The next deadline for the budget is December 13th.
- If no agreement can be reached, an additional \$19 Billion in sequester cuts will kick in on January 15th.
- The debt ceiling will again be reached on February 7th.
