#### **Legislative Update**

#### **LOCAL NEWS**

- The Bond Election was held on May 10<sup>th</sup>. The school bond proposition for \$125,000,000 failed with 73% percent voting against it. Final vote totals were 7,553 votes against the bond and 2,812 votes for it.
- The election for the School Board was also held on May 10<sup>th</sup>. The two candidates with the highest number of votes earned the open board seats. The results are:
  - o Elizabeth Yeager with 5,588 votes
  - o Bill Franklin with 4,617 votes
  - o Allyson Flack with 3,372 votes
  - o Kerry Maroney with 2,994 votes
  - Elizabeth Yeager and Bill Franklin were also the candidates that opposed the school bond.
- As of May 1<sup>st</sup>, the Temporary Water Reuse Project did not go online. The results of the samples sent off on March 11<sup>th</sup>, were expected from the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality by May 1<sup>st</sup>. The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality is still reviewing the documents turned in by the city. Once the project is approved, it will move 5 million gallons of water from the Red River Waste Water Treatment Plant to the Cypress Water Treatment Plant.

#### **STATE NEWS**

- 2014 Primary Runoff election Dates:
  - Early Voting: Mon, May 19<sup>th</sup>- Fri, May 23<sup>rd</sup>
  - Election Day: Tues, May 27<sup>th</sup>
- Toyota is moving its U.S. headquarters from Southern California to Plano, along with 4,000 people. This total includes moving employees from New York and Kentucky, as well as California. The high cost of living as well as high taxes in California has led some businesses to leave the state. Texas has lower taxes and fewer regulations. The process to transition to Texas can take up to two years.

#### **FEDERAL NEWS**

- The Justice Department has announced a new clemency process directed at low-level felons imprisoned for a minimum of 10 years. The inmates have to have a clean record to qualify. The Justice Department feels some of these punishments handed out the last few decades do not coincide with todays laws.
- The Supreme Court has ruled in a vote 5-

4 reaffirming the constitutionality of prayer before governmental meetings. The practice of praying before meetings will continue uncensored and uninterrupted throughout the nation.

• Indiana governor Mike Pence formally withdrew his state from Common Core, just to reinstitute it under another name. These actions will keep Indiana's education system under Common Core. This may be the sleeper issue for the 2016 presidential campaign. Rebranding Common Core seems to be a common theme for some states.
