Legislative Update

Local News

- The Community Facilities Action Team (CFAT)
 has finalized their recommendations which they
 will present to the school board. They are as
 follows:
 - 1. Concept B
 - a) Retain 3 high Schools.
 - b) Build one new school to replace Wichita Falls High School at a location to be determined.
 - c) Renovate Rider High School
 - d) Build a new stand-alone career center on district property.
 - e) \$110.7 million \$133.7 million
 - 2. Concept D-1
 - a) Have 2 high schools instead of 3.
 - b) Build 2 new high schools
 - c) Build 1 new career center
 - d) Close 1 high school and 1 junior high school.
 - e) Security and stadium improvements.
 - f) \$ 155 million \$189 million
 - 3. Concept A
 - a) Consolidate Rider and Wichita Falls high school grades 10-12 on a district site.
 - b) Build a 9th grade center close to the 10-12 high school, only for Rider and Wichita Falls high school students.
 - c) Hirschi will remain a comprehensive high school.
 - d) Build a career center.
 - e) Stadium, Junior High, and security improvements.
 - f) \$ 107.5 million \$145 million
- The school board will be making the final decision. The Bond Election will be held on May 10th.

State News

- The Texas Board of Education has voted to eliminate Algebra II as a requirement for high school graduation. This decision was part of a law approved in May by the State Legislature that withdrew some advanced courses as well as cutting the number of standardized tests students take from 15 to 5. The idea was that these changes would allow the students to concentrate on career and vocational training. Others worry that students will lack the necessary skills for taking the ACT and SAT. Those students that are in the honors program will still require Algebra II to graduate.
- The first CSCOPE lessons have been posted for review. 140 people participated in reviewing 431 CSCOPE lesson plans and posted the reviews at www.cscopereviews.com. CSCOPE has been renamed the TEKS Resource System.

Federal News

- Texas Rep. Roger Williams has long supported the fight to compensate the victims of the Fort Hood attack. He has sponsored a bill - H.R. 3111: Honoring the Fort Hood Heroes Act.
 - O To declare the November 5th attack at Fort Hood, Texas a terrorist attack, and to ensure the victims of the attack and their families receive the same honors and benefits as those Americans who have been killed or wounded in a combat zone overseas and their families.
 - This bill was referred to the subcommittee on Military Personal on November 6, 2013.

- The debt ceiling was reached on February 7th. The measures in place to fund the government will not last beyond February 27th.
- President Obama signed the 1,000 page Farm Bill on February 7th. The bill expands crop insurance for farmers by \$7 million over a decade and creates new subsidies for rice and peanut growers that would kick in when prices fall. There were cuts to the food stamp program that will affect 4% of recipients. It also closes a loophole that states use to increase benefits for food stamp recipients.
 - The Department of Homeland Security and the State Department now say that people considered to have provided "limited material support" to terrorists or terrorist groups are no longer automatically barred from the United States. These provisions have been in place since after September 11, 2001.

Read to Learn Program

It is generally accepted that the academic achievements of students are jeopardized if they are not reading on grade level by the end of third grade. These students are 4 times less likely to graduate on time, rising to 13 times less likely if poverty is involved. In October 2013 Wichita Falls ISD Partners in Education initiated a program to address this issue called Read2Learn.

Read2Learn matches a struggling or at-risk reader with a volunteer for a 30-minute structured tutoring session. The session includes the student reading aloud a short book based on their current reading level, and then answering questions about what they read. The session completed the is with demonstrating good reading by reading one or more books aloud to the child. The goal is to have each student working with a tutor for at least three sessions per week. The reading level each student is reevaluated every three weeks.

Most volunteers are able to tutor just one day a week. That means that three volunteers are needed for each student. Please consider volunteering 30 minutes a week to help a student enter fourth grade reading to learn rather than learning to read. Contact January Jones at 940-23-1009 for more information.

2014 Republican Primary Ballot Propositions

WHEREAS, Section 172.087, Election Code specifies that, "The state executive committee may provide by resolution that a proposal to include a demand for specific legislation or any other matter in the party's platform or resolutions be submitted to a vote by placement on the general primary election ballot"

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, The State Republican Executive Committee submits the following propositions for inclusion on the 2014 Republican General Primary Election ballot:

(Vote YES or NO on each proposition.)

Religious Freedom: Texans should be free to express their religious beliefs, including prayer, in public places.

Second Amendment: Texas should support Second Amendment liberties by expanding locations where concealed handgun license-holders may legally carry.

Franchise Tax: Texas should abolish the state franchise tax, also known as the margins tax, to encourage business growth.

Welfare Reform: Texas recipients of taxpayerfunded public assistance should be subject to random drug testing as a condition of receiving benefits.

No Lawmaker Exceptions: All elected officials and their staff should be subject to the same laws, rules, regulations, and ordinances as their constituents.

Obamacare: The Affordable Care Act, also known as "Obamacare," should be repealed.
